
Animals

We love all animals. During this month we will discuss different types, where they live and what they eat. Check out the below map activity detailing the different animals and where they live.




Migration

Birds, in the fall, after they've finished raising a family, they return to their winter homes. This seasonal travel from one place to another is called migration. Scientists call the kinds of birds that make these incredible journeys Neotropical migratory birds. Read about some of these feathered travelers and color pages featured in this book.



Weather

In preparation for the changes we are experiencing all of our students will learn about the weather. Remember, discuss at home brining the classroom to your home – is it sunny, cloudy, windy, rainy, snow. A fun read at home with the ANIMALS from Africa The porcupine smells rain in the air. Hibernation is a state of inactivity and metabolic depression in animals, characterized by lower body temperature, slower breathing, and lower metabolic rate.
